

Little Known **Stories** from **Tahoe's Past**

In Bill Morgan's book, **Morgan's Tahoe**, he tells over thirty intriguing stories of happenings at Tahoe in which he was involved from 1965 to 1989. That period was one of the most turbulent times in Tahoe's history. As Forest Supervisor of the Lake Tahoe Management Unit of the U.S Forest Service followed by several years as Executive Director of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency, he was caught up in the turbulence himself. His firsthand knowledge of those happenings has given him a unique perspective of Tahoe in those days. Most of these tales are little known by any except those who were involved themselves. Morgan will tell about a few of the more fascinating episodes, in particular ones that led to the spirit of cooperation on environmental matters that Tahoe is known for today.

Bill Morgan graduated from Michigan State University as a civil engineer following service in the U.S. Army and went to work with the U.S. Forest Service in 1959. His next position was at Lake Tahoe where he was in charge of management of the National Forest lands around the Lake. Ten years later he became the Executive Director of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency, a bi-state agency governing protection and development in the Lake Tahoe Basin.
